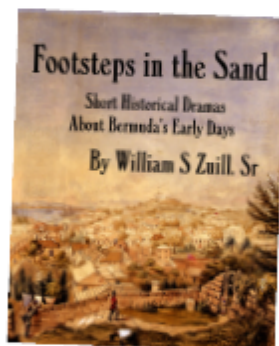

Footsteps in the Sand, with preface by the Hon. Dale Butler, M.P., is a dramatic way of looking at several leading figures in Bermuda's history. Designed originally by historian William Zuill Sr., Director Emeritus of the Bermuda National Trust, to be read aloud at the Trust's Christmas walkabouts, many of the readings tell stories connected with properties of the Trust. Most of them quote historic documents, and, with explanations, enrich our understanding of the story of Bermuda and her people.



Find out about the disagreement between Sir George Somers and Sir Thomas Gates, about that strange character Christopher Carter, our first inhabitant. Meet rascally racketeer Governor Samuel Day, who was followed by honest and able Governor Benjamin Bennett. Meet two slaves, one of whom, Jemmy Darrell, found success and manumission, and the other, Mary Prince, suffered bad luck until she, too, found freedom in London. You will find many other footsteps in the sand to enjoy, read with friends, or to use as learning tools.
