

# SAY MY NAME

Runaway and sale of slaves published in Bermuda newspaper  
From Bermuda Gazette .....later Royal Gazette 1784 to.....emancipation 1834  
Compiled by Conchita Ming (3.2023)

While doing research for my book, Dance Bermuda, I took note of the advertisements in the newspaper of runaway and sales of slaves. I felt compelled to write them down. It was/is heartwrenching to read the ads and see how black people were considered as property along with furniture and livestock; seeing people advertising to buy other people or worse being sold at a public vendue; being called 'wenches' and 'ditto' for negro.

I found myself cheering for those who ran away, especially if they were 'at large' for long periods. The newspaper did not report if 'runaways' were caught so it is not known what happened to them. They are heroes, none the less, yearning for freedom. I wanted to **SAY THEIR NAMES** ....to acknowledge them and even recognize their skills which helped to 'build' Bermuda,. So here, by date, is a list of the advertisements. It was interesting to note key events that were occurring in the world also.

What is key to viewing the newspaper entries about Bermuda slaves is to recognise just how racism can still exist in Bermuda today. We are talking about a mindset which existed in the white community up to & beyond the emancipation of the slaves (1834), barely 200 years ago....or just 2-3 generations ago! If we are going to move beyond this we must confront the past head on!!
